



‘Catch up’ Planning Statement

The government has announced £650 million will be shared across state primary and secondary schools over the 2020/21 academic year. This is expected to equate to approximately **£80 per pupil**.

Whilst head teachers will decide how the money is spent, the government expects this to be spent on small group tuition for whoever needs it.

This one-off grant to support pupils in state education recognises that all young people have lost time in education as a result of the pandemic, regardless of their income or background.

Separately, a National Tutoring Programme, worth £350 million, will increase access to high-quality tuition for the most disadvantaged young people over the 2020/21 academic year. This will help accelerate their academic progress and prevent the gap between them and their more affluent peers widening.

The funding is not available for interventions that remove pupils during the lessons and should only be targeted at morning, lunch or afterschool learning that is additional to the core teaching offer. Initial evaluations and assessments of gaps/barriers for groups of pupils

2. Barriers to future good attainment
A significant number of pupils have not fully engaged in mathematics and English on line learning during the lock down period – 70% (at least 7/10 children NOT engaging)
A smaller but still significant percentage of children have not engaged with any learning – online (or the paper packs that we produced for each and every year group). We estimate at least 60% of school have not been involved in any learning provided directly by school at all during lockdown and the period of non-mandatory school attendance
A group of pupils in every year group are displaying significant emotional well-being behaviours and are not coping with learning habits and concentrating on learning.
Some Year 2 pupils have not passed the phonics Year 1 screening on return to school.
Most EYFS Pupils have not had opportunity for rich and varied play – many not accessing a vocabulary rich environment for five months
Very low numbers of the children (approximately 60 – not including previous Y6) attended school in Summer Term - during the time it was not mandatory
Many pupils, about 60%, have been in homes where English is the second language. Of this group, many report that they have spoken no English at all during this period.

Additional Whole School Measures
<ol style="list-style-type: none"> All pupils have additional teaching and learning time: due to the alterations of school timings including a reduced lunchtime children now all have a minimum of two hours more teaching and learning time. Catch up sessions are being given to pupils in all year groups. Additional sessions after school run until 4pm – from Year 1 to Year 6 inclusive. Additional group time is being provided for interventions during the day in all year groups, in addition to the pre and post school catch-up sessions (this change does NOT use catch up funding). Catch up will be rolled out in two phases: Phase One is all of the additional interventions listed below except the use of tutors. Phase Two is the use of tutors from outside of school.

Notes: The grand total represents a £50 overspend. All year groups in KS2 will have access to 1:1 tutoring, however Y5 and Y6 will get twice the amount of Y3 and Y4 (maths and reading for Y5 and Y6, just reading for Y3 and Y4).
