1) Geography Skills and Fieldwork	<p>1) ALL - I can use simple fieldwork and observational skills to study the geography of the key human and physical features of the school's surrounding environment</p> <p>2) ALL - I can use aerial photographs and plans to recognise some landmarks MOST - I can use aerial photographs and plans to recognise landmarks to devise a simple map</p> <p>3) ALL - I can point out North, South, East and West on a map and compass MOST: I can use the compass points to describe the location of a place I am studying.</p> <p>4) ALL - I can use world maps and atlases to identify some countries, continents and oceans. MOST: I understand the difference between a country and a continent.</p>
2) Human and Physical Geography	<p>1) ALL - I can describe the key features of a place using words like beach, coast, forest, hill, mountain, ocean, valley MOST – I can identify the key features of a place using maps, atlases and photographs.</p> <p>2) ALL: I can explain what facilities a town or village might need. MOST – I can compare the facilities in a town and village. SOME – I can explain the differences between the facilities in a town and a village, giving reasons for these differences.</p> <p>3) ALL: I can recognise when people spoil the area or make it better MOST – I can explain why some changes might spoil an area or make it better. SOME - I can recognise when people spoil the area or make it better and think of some solutions.</p> <p>4) ALL - I can draw similarities and differences between different locations in the world. MOST – I can begin to explain why there may be differences by comparing their geographical features.</p> <p>5) ALL - I can explain the main features of a hot and cold place and locate a hot and cold region of the world. MOST – I can identify the Equator and North and South Poles on a map SOME – I can explain how a country's distance from the Equator and Poles can affect whether it's hot or cold.</p> <p>6) ALL - I can name key features associated with a town or village.</p>
3) Locational Knowledge	<p>1) ALL - I can name the capital cities of England, Wales, Scotland and Ireland MOST - I can identify the map symbol for a capital city SOME - I know the difference between cities and capital cities</p> <p>2) ALL - I can name the continents of the world. MOST - I can name the continents of the world and find them in an atlas.</p> <p>3) ALL - I can name the world's oceans.
