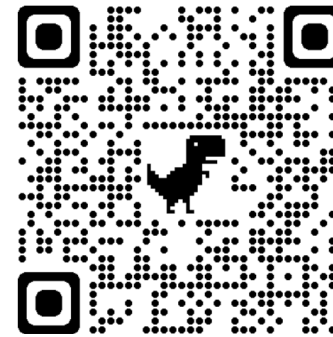


Science: Key Knowledge
